



DRESS CODE 2019-2020

The guidelines for dress at YGW have been developed in consultation with Rav Ahron Lopiansky, our Rosh HaYeshiva. They reflect the psak halacha and minhagim of our yeshiva, as well as our partnership with parents in creating a makom Torah and supporting our students' spiritual growth. We require that:

- ✓ Skirts cover the knees at all times. Please bear in mind that your daughter may grow over the course of the year and order skirts that will accommodate a growth spurt.
- ✓ Skirts overlap socks.
- ✓ Shirt sleeves cover the elbows.
- ✓ Shirts are buttoned so that the collarbone is covered.

Skirts and shirts: All skirts and shirts must be purchased from Fraylich Uniforms. Please refer to the order form (available in the front office) for a list of the Fraylich shirts that are included in our uniform. YGW t-shirts from past productions and shabbatonim are no longer part of our uniform.

Uniform pieces are available at Hats to Hose in Baltimore, and can also be ordered directly through Fraylich Uniforms. We invite you to visit our uniform gemach to see if any of the pieces will work for your daughter.

Sweaters and sweatshirts: Students may wear any of the YGW sweatshirts to school, or a solid-colored cardigan or zip-up sweatshirt in navy, grey, or black. Non-YGW cardigans and zip-up sweatshirts may not have any words or images printed on them. All cardigans and zip-up sweatshirts must be worn with a collared uniform shirt underneath.

Legwear: Students may wear tights or socks. Leggings may not be worn to school.

Shoes: Students must wear closed shoes or sneakers to school.

Fitness clothing: Students may wear loose-fitting pants and short sleeve shirts during fitness classes and production practice. Pants may not be worn at other times, even under a skirt.

Additional: Students are expected to come to school with natural hair color and may wear up to one earring in each ear.
